#### ADULT CONNECT

Table of Truth, a new Adult Connect Group, was started in February by Ed & Noelle Hall and Ken & Dana Rector. They believe studying God's Word and serving capture our attitude of worship. They go hand-in-hand. As God speaks to us through scripture, we can then act, living out our faith, and loving on others. Their first serving opportunity was at the Barmer's house. They worked together mowing, mulching, planting, and trimming; then turned the serving into a social gathering. Their group does life together from worshiping ... to connecting ... to serving! Adult Connect Groups meet at 9:00am and 10:30am Sunday mornings, 5:30pm Sunday evenings, and 6:30pm on Wednesdays.

#### **YTH CONNECT**

We connect our 6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> graders in small groups to help them grow in their relationship with Jesus. It's a time where an adult leader pours into them and teaches in an age and gender-specific setting. Our YTH Connect Groups meet on Sunday mornings at 9:00am and 10:30am in the B Building. ### **KIDS CONNECT** (1<sup>ST</sup>-5<sup>TH</sup> GRADE)

At 9:00am, we have Kids Worship. This exciting, high energy worship service engages kids in worship, shares Biblical truth and connects kids with one another. At 10:30am, our kids gather in a large group to hear the Bible story for the week. They spend the rest of the hour with others their age in small groups, applying the lesson to their own lives. #### **KIDS CONNECT** (BIRTH-KINDERGARTEN)

Children play with others their age and learn Bible stories with our incredible teachers. We have groups at 9:00am and 10:30am in the C Building every Sunday morning. Our preschool leaders use The Gospel Project curriculum. Vicki Mashburn, pictured here, and her husband Greg, teach 3 year olds at 10:30am.

#### **D** GROUPS

2019 saw the launch of Adult and YTH Discipleship Groups (or "D Groups") at TSC. This is a way of connecting in smaller groups to grow in our relationship with Jesus. Made up of 4 to 6 people who meet weekly, D Groups go through scripture together, hold each other accountable, and pray for one another.

# 7º Neighborhoods

#### EASTER EGG HUNTS

We took our Egg Hunts to the neighborhoods again this year with 16 different partnering opportunities for Thompson Station Church to live out our values and be "community builders." Egg Hunts were held in Bridgemore Village, Cherry Grove, Wyngate, Canterbury, Stream Valley, Campbell Station, Spring Hill Place, Wade's Grove, Tollgate, Aston Woods, Churchill Farms, Dakota Pointe, and Brixworth. In Columbia, we also held hunts in the Malibu neighborhood, Riverside Elementary, and the Boys & Girls Club at Spring Hill Elementary.

#### BACKYARD BIBLE CLUB

The Gilley and Harrell kids love sharing God with their neighbors, and are truly living out our "Power of 7" vision, sharing their faith with seven of their peers. After VBS, Jack and Kate Gilley, along with Lila and Graham Harrell, hosted their second-annual Backyard Bible Club in their neighborhood. These four organized games, led worship, and taught a Bible study, with a little help from their parents. This year they had more than twice as many neighbors come than last year. These pre-teens are leading by example!



# 7 Cities



#### CONNECTION CHURCH COLUMBIA, TN

We were so excited to celebrate with Pastor Eric Nichols and the Columbia Campus their fifth anniversary in September 2019 - we have seen God work there in mighty ways over the last year. Each Sunday, they are averaging 355 attendance in worship and 222 in Connect Groups. This summer they had over 160 kids attend VBS, 100 of which were first-time guests from the community. Late summer 2019, the Lord began to lay on Pastor Tom's heart that now is the right time to allow our Columbia Campus to become TSC's newest church plant. In March of 2020, Columbia will transition from a campus of Thompson Station Church to its own church body, known as Connection Church. These are exciting days for everyone. The kingdom is being expanded on every side!



### **GRACE POINT FELLOWSHIP CINCINNATI. OH**

Our church plant, led by Pastor Reagan Wagoner, bought, remodeled, and moved into their own space in 2019. Their ministry is thriving with 270 in average attendance, 300 kids at VBS this summer, and 60 decisions. Grace Point Fellowship has 38 Grace Groups throughout the community and recently increased to two services on Sunday morning.



#### THE WELL CHURCH LAS VEGAS, NV

Three years ago we planted The Well Church under the leadership of Pastor Steve Witt. In spite of the strongholds of spiritual blackness in "sin city," The Well is already averaging 220 in attendance. They've baptized 65 people (with 19 more waiting to be baptized) this year. And, they are in the process of building a 10,000 sq ft building on 3.8 acres of land they recently purchased.

#### UNREACHED VILLAGES - INDIA

There are more than 7,000 unreached people groups (UPGs) in the world today (Joshua Project). In 2019, Thompson Station Church decided to focus on how we can reach these UPGs. One way we are doing that is through our partnership with Billy Graham Paulose and his ministry, Unreached Villages. They work with UPGs all over the nation of India. Pastor Billy and his team have planted 400+ churches, provided a Christian education for the Dalits, or "untouchables." provided countless meals, and met other basic needs for those in the leper and blind communities. God has continued to bless this ministry by opening a door to enter the colleges and universities and sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ. TSC is excited about this new partnership and expectant for all that God is going to do in India!



#### **ALBANIA**

God is at work in Albania, a predominantly Muslim country, where many are without the hope of Jesus Christ. A TSC mission team has partnered with Hope for the World to bring the Good News to children and families who may have never heard the gospel. In 2019, our mission team saw 19 people give their lives to Christ. One was a little girl who attended Vacation Bible Time (VBT), prayed to receive Christ the first night, and went home to excitedly tell her mother all that she had learned. Upset that her daughter was learning about Jesus, her mother would not allow her to return to VBT. Despite her mother's wishes, the little girl returned the second night to tell someone about the decision she had made to follow Jesus.

Another night our mission team prayed for an elder of this Muslim community to be saved. At the end of the church service. the elder came forward saying that he wanted to follow Jesus. He stood before the people of his community, shared what the Lord had done in his heart, and boldly proclaimed that he was now a follower of Jesus!
